The Heads of Colleges – of all colleges – are united in being both sceptical and critical of a range of proposed changes that would effectively pass the management of commercial services out of the colleges' hands and under the line management of the Estates and Buildings. We have pressed very hard to oppose these changes and hope to have opened up space for further discussion. I will report on these conversations at a later date.

In the meantime, the Castle community is in excellent health and is as vibrant and dynamic as ever. Our lecture series are flourishing, the JCR has just elected its new Exec and the MCR has organised its first ever postgraduate ball. We even beat Hatfield for the eighth consecutive year in the annual Erg Challenge! I look forward to meeting many more of you at our next alumni event, which is kindly sponsored by City & Guilds.


